ECAbit Network

Many ECAbit Network members are located in countries that have been undergoing a transformation from planned to market economies. Business incubators and technology parks in ECA play a key role in fostering innovation and entrepreneurship. The ECA Network of Business Incubators and Technology Parks was launched in May 2005 at the ECA regional workshop in Kiev, Ukraine. In **September 2007, the ECA incubators regional workshop in Yerevan, Armenia**, will focus on the role of business incubators and technology parks in innovation development and technology transfer in economies in transition.
